


Stamnes Marina, North Arm Captain Cove Marina, South Arm 1600 - 1800 hours, September 6

CRUISING GUIDE TO THE GULF ISLANDS: By - Bill Wolferstan


This book contains detailed information on navigational problems not included in Government Charts and Publications.

Where to go, and what to see and what to watch out for make this a valuable addition to any mariner's library.

EASY CLAM CHOWDER:

Substitute freshly-dug clams, and this is a great lunch on a cold day.

ABOUT 15 MINUTES BEFORE SERVING: Into 2-cup measure, drain liquid from one 6½- or 8-ounce can minced or chopped clams; add enough water to make 1½ cups. In 2-quart saucepan over medium heat, heat one 10¾-ounce can condensed cream of potato soup, undiluted, ¼ cup nonfat dry-milk powder, clam liquid and clams just to boiling, stirring occasionally. For garnish, sprinkle 2 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled, on top. Makes 3½ cups or 4 servings.
