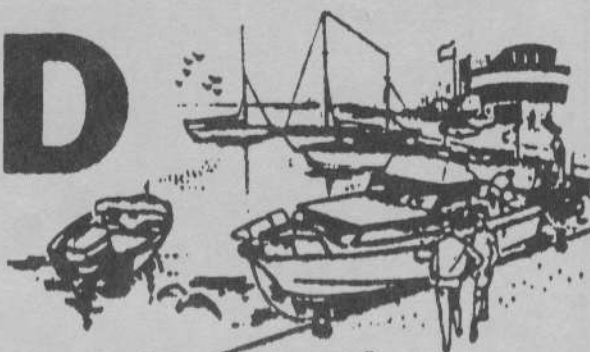

1977/1978 TRAINING COURSES

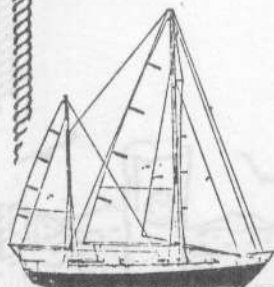

THE REPAIR OF WOODEN BOATS

The attraction of wooden boats is being rediscovered but inevitably, more often than not, they need repair as well as the usual maintenance. John Lewis, who has had over thirty years of practical experience in converting and repairing his own craft, covers virtually every part of the boat that is liable to need attention, explaining with the aid of diagrams and photographs how repairs can be done.

COOKS

STEAMED PRAWNS

1 lb. green, unshelled prawns
(serves 2 to 3)

In bottom of large steamer pan, place 12 oz. water and 1 bottle beer. Cover and bring to a boil. Place unpeeled prawns in steamer insert in a single layer. Cover pan and steam until pink-red (approx. 4 - 5 minutes) Remove prawns to heated serving platter and hold in a warm oven while completing the steaming of prawns. To serve, dip in warm 'SHERRY-MUSTARD BUTTER'.

SHERRY MUSTARD BUTTER (approx. 1c)

Melt 3/4 cup butter in medium-sized saucepan. Stir in 2 tbsp. dry sherry, 2 tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice, 1/2 tsp. Dijon-style mustard and 1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper. Heat well, but do not boil. Use as a dipping sauce.

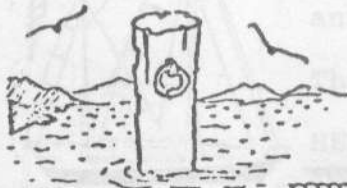

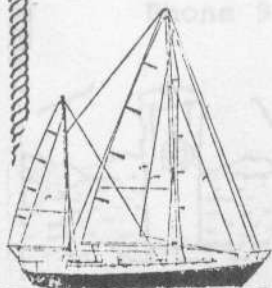
