THE PACIFIC PRINCESSES

by Robert D. Turner (Sono Nis Press, 1977)

In 1901 the Canadian Pacific Railway Company acquired control of the pioneering Canadian Pacific Navigation Company which for 20 years had provided the principal steamship services on the British Columbia coast. Within a few years the CPR transformed the CPN's assortment of outdated coastal freighters, passenger steamers, and ancient paddlewheelers into a modern fleet of luxurious coastal liners - the Princess ships. This is their story, told candidly but with affection.

QUICK CIOPPINO

2 lbs. cleaned whole green prawns
1-1/2 cups chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/3 cup olive oil
3 cloves garlic, minced
3 tins (7-1/2 oz) tomato sauce
1 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp freshly ground pepper
freshly cooked hot spaghetti
Parmesan cheese, grated
Fresh parsley, chopped




