See a BLOW? Go SLOW!

It's a Matter of Boater and Whale Safety.

- Whale sightings are frequent in this area.
- Collisions happen causing injury to boaters and whales.
- Whales, especially Humpbacks, can surface suddenly and be very unaware of boats.
- · Be on the lookout for blows at all times.
- · Go slow if you see a blow.
- · The Whale Watch Flag, when raised on boats, warns whales are near.
- Give whales space, at least 200m but consider whale size and behaviour for safe distance. Know the Marine Mammal Regulations*.
- Be alert for aggregations of birds. This often means there is a lot of feed and thereby an enhanced chance of whale presence.
- Please report incidents e.g. disturbance, collision and entanglement to DFO's Reporting Line 1-800-465-4336 or Coast Guard VHF 16.
- See www.SeeABlowGoSlow.org for more information. Includes *Marine Mammal Regulations, areas of known whale density, what to do in case of whale entanglement, and Be Whale Wise guidelines
